<u>Utah</u> is all about <u>outdoor recreation</u>. It is known for many amazing outdoor activities. If you're seeking a weekend of hiking or backpacking, Utah has countless options. For starters, one could spend years exploring all of the nooks and crannies of just one of the five national parks, 44 state parks, nine national monuments, five national forests and two national recreation areas. Thats a whopping 22.8 million acres of public lands which make up almost 42 percent of Utah outdoors. These lands range from snowcapped mountains of remote mountain ranges to wild rivers and colorful red rock canyons.



The internet is a great place to start planning for trips and finding trip ideas like TripAdvisor.com, WanderLog.com, Expedia.com, Travelocity.com. Sometimes Chamber of Commerce sites are amazing sources for finding locals' favorite activities, food, and upcoming events. For example Moab Area Chamber of Commerce has staff on site that will help you find Moab residents favorite things to do, favorite bike trails, favorite food places and etc.

There are many tourist apps that will connect you to places to visit, best beaches, best trails, best places to rest your tired old bones and muscles, plus many more like Hopper for Travel opportunities, TopoMaps for trail hiking, or TripIt for amazing road trips.

What a lot of travelers miss during trip planning are the local sporting goods stores like REI, Sportsman Warehouse, Recreation Outlets. These people know more about hang out spots, places to fish, places to hike, places to kayak that are close by. A great source for travel planning, for sure.
